

## CASE #1

Ann, 2<sup>nd</sup> year MA student of International Affairs (IA), is planning her course list for the spring 2008 semester. Besides the core courses he has to take – Research Methods (Res504) and Statistics (Stat507), IA offers 4 electives – Principles of Democratic Development (PolSci555), Modern Terrorism (IR675), Reforms and Transitional Economy (Econ705), and International Economics (Econ605).
