

## CASE #2

Ann, 2<sup>nd</sup> year MA student of International Affairs (IA), is planning her course list for the spring 2008 semester. Besides the core courses he has to take – Research Methods (Res504) and Statistics (Stat507), IA offers 4 electives – Principles of Democratic Development (PolSci555), Modern Terrorism (IR675), Reforms and Transitional Economy (Econ705), and International Economics (Econ605). Ann decides to choose from her program electives only one – Modern Terrorism. She also wants to register for two electives offered by other programs – International Finance Law and Development (Law615) and Elections and Politics Reporting (Media710). She discusses her choice with her Program Coordinator. During the consultation it becomes clear that Ann makes 120 credits and 19 courses overall. Because IA program offers only 19 courses Ann does not have to pay extra fees. Following her Coordinator approval she seeks to enroll in the selected classes. The Law Program accepts her, but the Media Management program has the quota filled for the Media710 class. Ann tries to make changes in her Course Registration Card, but it is too late – all the quotas are filled out. She does not make the deadline for registration. Thus, Ann has to take all classes offered by IA program as prescribed by the procedure.
