

### CASE #3

Gocha, 2<sup>nd</sup> year MA student of International Affairs (IA), is planning his course list for the spring 2008 semester. Besides the core courses he has to take – Research Methods (Res504) and Statistics (Stat507), IA offers 4 electives – Principles of Democratic Development (PolSci555), Modern Terrorism (IR675), Reforms and Transitional Economy (Econ705), and International Economics (Econ605). Gocha decides to choose from his program electives only two – Modern Terrorism and International Economics. At the same time, he wants to take two courses from other programs. These are Public Speaking (Media845), and Organizational Behavior (Mgt580). Gocha discusses his choice with his Program Coordinator. During the consultation it becomes clear that Gocha makes 123 credits and 20 courses overall. Because IA program offers only 19 courses Gocha will have to pay for the extra course taken. That course in this case would be Public Speaking (Media845) because that course is the last elective in Gocha's Course Registration card as shown below. The fee is determined by the program offering the said course; in this case by the program in Local Governance. Following the standard procedure and payment Gocha is registered to take the courses of his choice.
